Welcome to Krooner park.

We would especially like to welcome the players, directors and supporters of today's visitors Colliers Wood United FC.

Since we were last here at Krooner Park, for the FA Vase tie v Fisher, we've played just the one game. We were due to play Epsom and Ewell last weekend but this was postponed due to their continuing success in the FA Cup. The Fisher game was a frustrating one. We felt as though we did more than enough to get through to next round of the Vase, and we would've done but for some slack finishing, miraculous goalkeeping and the width of the post and cross bar. As it was, Fisher won it in injury time with an unbelievable free kick that flew in off the far post.

There's still a few lads away on holiday over the next couple of weeks but as I said, the strength of the squad is good and hopefully results won't be affected by these absences.

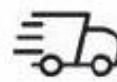

The club was established in 1895 after a discussion at St Michael's church, and was originally named St Michael's Foot-ball Club, although they became known as St Michael's, Camberley.

The first match, a friendly, was played on 16 October against D Company from the Royal Military College in nearby Sandhurst, St Michael's won 4–2. In January 1896 they joined the Surrey County Football Association, entering and winning the Surrey Junior Cup in 1897–98; the club's first competitive game was played on 16 October 1897, a Junior Cup first round match against Farncombe which St Michael's won 5–2. After winning the cup, the club joined the East & West Surrey League for the 1898–99 season.

In January 1901 a public meeting was held, at which it was decided to establish a new club that would absorb both St Michael's and Camberley Magpies. The name Camberley & Yorktown was adopted and the club took St Michael's place in the East & West Surrey League. However, they dropped into the Aldershot Combination in 1902, before switching to the Ascot & District League in 1903. The club finished as runners-up in their first season and went on to win the league in 1904–05. They were runners-up again in 1905–06, before winning a hat-trick of successive titles in 1907–08, 1908–09 and 1909–10, remaining unbeaten throughout the third of the title-winning seasons. The season also saw them win the Surrey Junior Cup for a second time, beating Sutton United 2–0 in the final. In 1910 Camberley & Yorktown returned to the East & West Surrey League, which had been renamed the West Surrey League. In 1912–13 the club also entered the three-club Aldershot Senior Civilian League, which they won. They went on to win the West Surrey League the following season.

In 1922 Camberley & Yorktown were founder members of the Surrey Senior League. They won three successive titles in 1930–31, 1931–32 and 1932–33 and were runners-up in 1938–39. After World War II the club was renamed Camberley, and were Surrey Senior League runners-up in 1946–47, before winning the league's Charity Cup in 1951–52 with a 4–3 win over Chertsey Town. The club were league runners-up again in 1961–62, and adopted their current name on 2 June 1967 after merging with former Parthenon League club

Camberley Wanderers. In 1973 they joined the Spartan League, but left to join Division Two of the Athenian League in 1975. In 1977 they switched to Division Two of the Isthmian League, and were promoted to Division One after finishing as Division Two runners-up in 1978–79. Two seasons later they were relegated, and after a single season back in Division Two, they rejoined the Athenian League, which now had a single division.

In 1983 Rick Wakeman became the club's chairman while he was living in Camberley. He remained in this post until 1986 when he was elected Vice-President, and left the club when he moved to the Isle of Man in 1988. In 1984 the Athenian League disbanded; Camberley rejoined the Isthmian League and were placed in Division Two South, where they remained until being placed in Division Three following league reorganisation in 1991. In 1998–99 the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time. Drawn against away to Third Division Brentford, they lost 5–0. Division Three became Division Two in 2002, and Camberley remained members until the end of the 2005–06 season, when they dropped into the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League through the FA's re-structuring of non-league football. They were runners-up in the division in 2013–14 and 2014–15. They came third in the 2015–16 season in the North division of the Combined counties league 2016–17 saw a sixth place finish and seventh the season after. 2018–19 saw a sixteenth place finish and with the 2019–20 season not finishing and the 2020–21 one not even starting due to covid, they started the 2021–22 season in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and Manager Luke Turkington oversaw a twelfth place finish on 44 points. 2022–23 Season was an improvement on the previous finishing tenth with 52 Points, with a fantastic run of 1 defeat in the last 14 league games of the season, that was at a time when games were coming thick and fast as the season had to be extended by 2 weeks to make up for the bad weather earlier in the campaign.

GROUND

In 1898 the club started playing at the new Recreation Ground on London Road, although they also used a pitch near Southwell Park Road when the Recreation Ground was unavailable and had moved there permanently by 1905. They played there until moving to Martin's Meadow in 1909. However, when the tenancy came to an end, the club returned to the Recreation Ground. Since 1923 the club have played at Krooner Park on Wilton Road. The ground was paid for with the winnings of a horse named Krooner who won two races at Haydock Park Racecourse in 1920.

It was officially opened on 26 December 1923. Due to financial difficulties Krooner Park was sold back to the local council in 1939 with the council guaranteeing that the ground would be retained in perpetuity and that it would be rented to the football club, giving them priority whilst they remained in existence. In the mid-1960s the club asked the council to leave Krooner Park and build a new ground at South-cote Park Farm, but the request was rejected due to the amount of engineering that would be required.

Floodlights were installed at the ground in 1974, with the first floodlit match being a friendly against Crystal Palace on 14 October. The attendance at the match, which ended in a 1–1 draw, was around 3,100, a ground record. The highest confirmed attendance at Krooner Park was 2,066 when the newly-formed Aldershot Town visited for an Isthmian League Division Three match on 10 November 1992.

DIRECTIONS

From A23 (Thornton Road) turn into Silverleigh Road, bear left into Trafford Road and then into Mayfield Road. The ground is situated along a private road where you will find a car park adjacent to the ground. There is a height restriction on the private road.

Nearest bus route is 60 alighting on Galpins Road at the Silverleigh Road bus stop. Walk through Mayfield Park and down the private road to the Stadium. Many buses serve Thornton Heath Pond which is adjacent to Thornton Road.

Nearest train stations are Thornton Heath or Norbury which are both a 20 minute walk away. Nearest Tram Stop is Therapia Lane which is a 15 minute walk away.

There is a tea bar directly behind the stand accessed from outside and there is a bar inside.

The car park is a reasonable size but with the increased attendance they sometimes get now due to their celebrity owners there are a few more people through the gates, so space might be limited.

AFC Croydon Athletic is INSIDE the expanded ULEZ Zone please check your car is compliant or you will need to pay £12.50 a day.

Formed : 1874

CLUB HISTORY

The club, one of the oldest in the country, and which has now been in existence for 148 years, received a well deserved recognition award from the FA for 125 years of playing football during 2011.

There is a wall memorial at the Surrey FA headquarters in Dorking acknowledging The Wood as the second oldest senior football club in Surrey having been formed in 1874 (four years after Reigate Priory FC).

Colliers Wood United FC was founded way back in 1874 and the early years of their existence were spent in the Wimbledon and Sutton leagues before moving on to the Surrey Intermediate League (Southern Division). During the late sixties and early seventies, the club were members of the Surrey Senior League for a short time, playing in the newly formed division one where they won the league title in 1969/70. The reserves won their division in 1970/71 going undefeated.

Over the years, "The Wood" have reached a number of Surrey FA Cup Finals. In 1988/89 they lost 1-2 to Bradbank Sports in the Intermediate Cup Final. In 1991/92 they beat Woking & Horsell 4-0 in the final of the same competition. The reserves reached the final of the 1988/89 and 1989/90 Lower Junior Cup but were beaten on both occasions.

The local recreation ground prevented the progress of the club due to the limited facilities and a search for a new ground was launched. Adequate facilities were found at Wibbandune Sports Ground in 1991 and the ground has steadily improved since then.

2001/2 saw the club enter the Surrey County Senior League where they finished a creditable 5th. The following season, they finished as runners up.

In 2002/3, the league amalgamated with the Combined Counties League and the club were founder members of the new division 1 where they finished as runners up and were promoted to the Premier Division.

They have continued to improve. In 2004/5, they finished 14th of the 24 clubs. The following season, they finished fourth and had a fine FA Vase run, beating Chichester City United, Raynes Park Vale and Greenwich Borough, before losing to VCD Athletic in the 2nd round proper.

In 2006/7 they entered the FA Cup for the first time, defeating Chipstead after a replay before succumbing to Worthing 0-3.

After a brief ground share at Croydon FC, the club moved back to Wibbandune where ground improvements included the addition of excellent flood-lighting, a new covered terrace and a 120 seat stand. In March 2012, the club added a new away team changing room, new spectator ground lavatories and relaid the entire playing surface including drainage thanks to a £71,000 grant from the Football Association. They also reached the 2011/12 final of the League Cup at Farnborough FC on 4th May v Guernsey FC in front of 667 spectators, which they lost 0-2 after extra time, becoming the first club to keep a 90 minute clean sheet against The Islanders. Following a second renovation of the pitch in April, the club returned to Wibbandune in July 2013 and the under 18 youth section was re-started.

In 2014/15, Wood reached the FA Vase 4th round (last 32 nationally) and the Surrey Senior Cup quarter finals for the first time in their history. They reached the final of the League Cup once again in 2014/15 but, once again, they lost in extra time, this time 1-2 to Camberley Town in front of 385 spectators at Woking FC.

On March 8th 2016, the club were awarded the FA Charter Standard accreditation by the Football Association.

The club won the CCL Sportsmanship Award for 2015/16 having received just 32 cautions throughout the season.

In 2016/17, the reserve team won the SSEC Junior League Cup and were runners up in the Surrey FA Junior Cup.

Wood 1st team have reached the Surrey FA Senior Cup quarter finals for only the second time in 2017/18.

In March 2022, our under 18 (west) team were crowned champions of their division as the club looked to move forward and develop their youth football section.

England Deaf Men name World Championship squad

The 4th World Deaf Football Championships will take place in Kuala Lumpur between Wednesday 20 September and Sunday 8 October

England Deaf Men have named their squad for this year's World Deaf Football Championships in Malaysia.

Sam Manoochehri has named a 20-man squad for what will be his first major tournament since being confirmed as the new head coach in May.

England will face Thailand, Mali and Ghana in late September during the group stage, before hopefully going on to secure a medal in the knockout rounds.

The FA's senior technical performance manager for para football, James Watkins, said: "The Deaf Men's World Championships is an exciting international occasion for The FA. It represents the first time we have led the team in a Deaf Men's World Championships since resuming stewardship of the squad.

"It is also the first outing for our talented head coach, Sam Manoochehri. Sam has made a brilliant start to his tenure and has prepared the squad well through the introduction of a coherent camp and games model.

"We have a strong mix of experience and youth and significant attacking options which we feel will trouble the best opposition in World Deaf Football.

"The tournament will provide us with a benchmark of our progress since taking over the squad. We have strong aspirations to medal and will relish playing in a challenging games programme whilst in Malaysia.

"The players are extremely motivated to succeed, and our final prep will occur in our August and September camps at St George's Park. We are confident our players will represent the Three Lions with pride and will have a significant impact on the tournament."

Members of the England Deaf Men squad during the multi-squad training camp in Tenerife at the start of the year. England will kick off their World Deaf Football Championships campaign with a game against Thailand on Saturday 23rd September, before facing Mali two days later.

The final group game will see the Para Lions take on Ghana on Wednesday 27 September, with all three matches kicking off at 8.30pm local time (1.30pm UK) and taking place at the UITM Stadium in Kuala Lumpur.

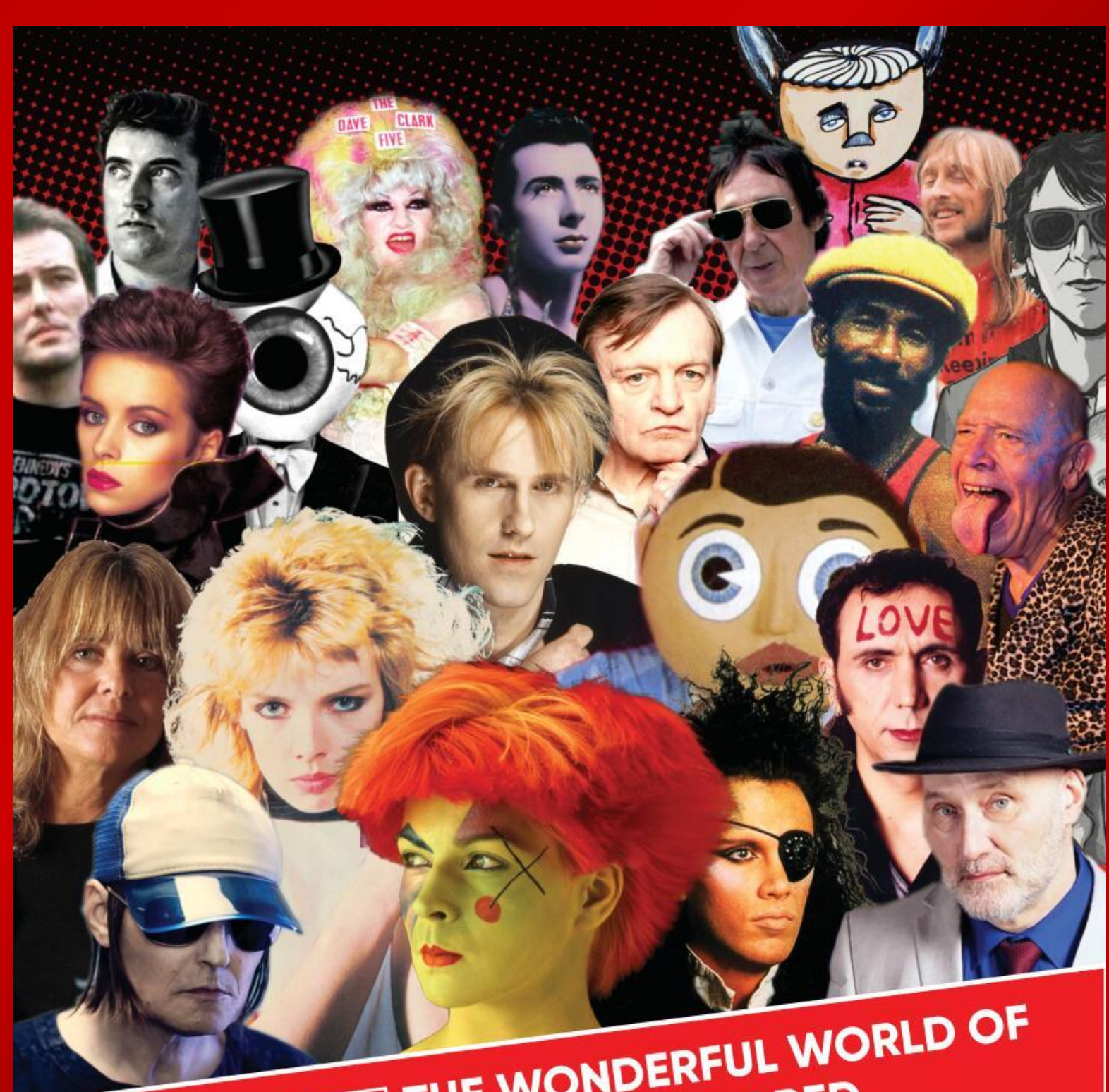
