### **Management Mutterings**

Good afternoon and welcome to Krooner Park, the home of Camberley Town F.C. for today's Combined Counties Premier Division South fixture. In particular of course to the Committee, Players, Management and supporters of our visitors Sandhurst Town, and also to our mascots

After 2 away games, we return to Krooner Park for what I'm sure will be a keenly contested local derby. Our last home was a much needed 2-0 victory against a good Horley Town side. We let ourselves down in the away fixture a few weeks ago, letting slip a 2-0 and 3-1 lead to come away with nothing, so it was good to not only take all 3 points but also to keep a clean sheet. The day was a big success all round with over 220 people coming through the turnstile including ex players from the late 90's down to todays under 8's from the Camberley Town Youth Football Club. A massive thanks to Barrie Funnell and Ben Clifford for organising the day and the atmosphere created by the extra supporters really made a difference to players. Last Saturday saw an early kick off away at Spelthorne. They've struggled to pick up points of late and underwent a complete rebuild just a few weeks in to the season. We were confident we could get something from the game and the boys started out really well. Kingsley grabbed us an early much deserved goal but this was swiftly followed by a mistake gifting the home side an equaliser. Again we went on the front foot and Sam Whitehead curled home a beauty from the corner with just a few minutes to go until half time. Disappointingly we couldn't make it to the break in front and an almost carbon copy goal allowed the home side to make it 2-2 after 45. The dressing room at half time was not for the easily offended! In the end we counted ourselves slightly fortunate to come away with a point as Spelthorne dominated the second half. Only the post and Stuart Norman prevented them from sending us home with nothing. Then we went to Cobham on Tuesday. The less said about that the better but a brief outline is 2-0 up and absolutely coasting after 50 minutes only to concede 3 times in 25 minutes and get nothing whatsoever from the game. Hugely disappointing is a huge understatement and the habit of shipping goals when we've managed to get our noses in front simply has to stop. Everybody in the group needs to take a step back and ask themselves honestly if they're doing enough. That's not just players but anyone who is in our home changing room today is partly responsible for whatever result we achieve. On a positive note, today provides an opportunity to right the last 2 results. Sandhurst Town has changed enormously over the last few years. It's a different club to the one I walked in to 10 years ago and is one on the up. They're full of excellent young players who look to play as much football as possible on their new artificial pitch. It's the first 2 games that I look for when the fixtures are published and it's always a pleasure to catch up with Tony Dean, who is basically Mr Sandhurst Town! We were unfortunate to not nick all 3 points at Bottom Meadow earlier in the season but we'll be hoping to do that today against a young and very

energetic opposition.

We're welcoming another CTYFC team to accompany the players on the pitch today. It's the turn of one of our u9's teams who you'll see in the line up today and we'd like to thank the players, their parents and coach Phil for their support this afternoon. Let's hope they bring us some luck and another 3 points!

### **Our History**

The club was established in 1895 after a discussion at St Michael's church, and was originally named St Michael's Foot-ball Club, although they became known as St Michael's, Camberley. The first match, a friendly, was played on 16 October against D Company from the Royal Military College in nearby Sandhurst, St Michael's won 4–2. In January 1896 they joined the Surrey County Football Association, entering and winning the Surrey Junior Cup in 1897–98; the club's first competitive game was played on 16 October 1897, a Junior Cup first round match against Farncombe which St Michael's won 5–2. After winning the cup, the club joined the East & West Surrey League for the 1898–99 season.

In January 1901 a public meeting was held, at which it was decided to establish a new club that would absorb both St Michael's and Camberley Magpies. The name Camberley & Yorktown was adopted and the club took St Michael's place in the East & West Surrey League. However, they dropped into the Aldershot Combination in 1902, before switching to the Ascot & District League in 1903. The club finished as runners-up in their first season and went on to win the league in 1904–05. They were runners-up again in 1905–06, before winning a hat-trick of successive titles in 1907–08, 1908–09 and 1909–10, remaining unbeaten throughout the third of the title-winning seasons. The season also saw them win the Surrey Junior Cup for a second time, beating Sutton United 2–0 in the final. In 1910 Camberley & Yorktown returned to the East & West Surrey League, which had been renamed the West

Surrey League. In 1912–13 the club also entered the three-club Aldershot Senior Civilian League, which they won. They went on to win the West Surrey League the following season.

In 1922 Camberley & Yorktown were founder members of the Surrey Senior League. They won three successive titles in 1930 –31, 1931–32 and 1932–33 and were runners-up in 1938–39. After World War II the club was renamed Camberley, and were Surrey Senior League runners-up in 1946–47, before winning the league's Charity Cup in 1951–52 with a 4–3 win over Chertsey Town. The club were league runners-up again in 1961–62, and adopted their current name on 2 June 1967 after merging with former Parthenon League club

Camberley Wanderers. In 1973 they joined the Spartan League, but left to join Division Two of the Athenian League in 1975. In 1977 they switched to Division Two of the Isthmian League, and were promoted to Division One after finishing as Division Two runners-up in 1978–79. Two seasons later they were relegated, and after a single season back in Division Two, they rejoined the Athenian League, which now had a single division.

In 1983 Rick Wakeman became the club's chairman while he was living in Camberley. He remained in this post until 1986 when he was elected Vice-President, and left the club when he moved to the Isle of Man in 1988. In 1984 the Athenian League disbanded; Camberley rejoined the Isthmian League and were placed in Division Two South, where they remained until being placed in Division Three following league reorganisation in 1991. In 1998–99 the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time. Drawn against away to Third Division Brentford, they lost 5–0. Division Three became Division Two in 2002, and Camberley remained members until the end of the 2005–06 season, when they dropped into the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League through the FA's re-structuring of non-league football. They were runners-up in the division in 2013–14 and 2014–15.

They came third in the 2015-16 season in the North division of the Combined counties league 2016-17 saw a sixth place finish and seventh the season after. 2018-19 saw a sixteenth place finish and with the 2019-20 season not finishing and the 2020-21 one not even starting due to covid, they started the 2021-22 season in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and Manager Luke Turkington oversaw a twelfth place finish on 44 points. 2022-23 Season was an improvement on the previous finishing tenth with 52 Points, with a fantastic run of 1 defeat in the last 14 league games of the season, that was at a time when games were coming thick and fast as the season had to be extended by 2 weeks to make up for the bad weather earlier in the campaign.

#### **GROUND**

In 1898 the club started playing at the new Recreation Ground on London Road, although they also used a pitch near Southwell Park Road when the Recreation Ground was unavailable and had moved there permanently by 1905. They played there until moving to Martin's Meadow in 1909. However, when the tenancy came to an end, the club returned to the Recreation Ground.

Since 1923 the club have played at Krooner Park on Wilton Road. The ground was paid for with the winnings of a horse named Krooner who won two races at Haydock Park Racecourse in 1920.

It was officially opened on 26 December 1923. Due to financial difficulties Krooner Park was sold back to the local council in 1939 with the council guaranteeing that the ground would be retained in perpetuity and that it would be rented to the football club, giving them priority whilst they remained in existence. In the mid-1960s the club asked thee council to leave Krooner Park and build a new ground at South- cote Park Farm, but the request was rejected due to the amount of engineering that would be required.

Floodlights were installed at the ground in 1974, with the first floodlit match being a friendly against Crystal Palace on 14 October. The attendance at the match, which ended in a 1–1 draw, was around 3,100, a ground record. The highest confirmed attendance at Krooner Park was 2,066 when the newly-formed Aldershot Town visited for an Isthmian League Division Three match on 10 November 1992.





### Sandhurst Town

**Formed: 1910** 

**Home Ground: Bottom Meadow** 

**Last Season: 1st Combined Counties Division One** 



Sandhurst Football Club was formed in 1910 and played in the Reading & District League until 1979 apart from a short spell in the East Berkshire Football League. In 1979, the Club was elected into the Aldershot & District Football League.1984 saw the Club finish as runners-up from whence they became founder members of the Chiltonian Football League and a stepping-stone toward becoming a senior club.



The best season in the Chiltonian Football League was in 1986-1987 when they finished in second place. In 1990 the Club applied for membership of the Combined Counties Football League and was granted senior status by the Berks & Bucks County Football Association. The first two seasons were disastrous finishing in bottom place on each occasion and only escaped relegation back to the Chiltonian Football League at the end of the second season due to the resignation of another member club. However, the form of the Club improved dramatically thereafter over several years with managers Peter Browning and subsequently John Underwood bringing the club cup and league success.

The first ground used by the Club was a field adjacent to the Bull & Butcher public house that may well have been used as the club headquarters. After a few years, a move was made to the Memorial Park where the Club remained until the 1996 close season, apart from a couple of seasons during the 1950s spent on a nearby pitch in St. John's Road.

The introduction of the National Lottery prompted an immediate bid for funding for a new ground in Bottom Meadow adjacent to the Memorial Park. With support and backing through additional matched funding from Bracknell Forest Borough Council and Sandhurst Town Council, the Club was successful in the first round of allocations by the National Lotteries Charities Board. The new facilities opened in August 1997 at a cost of £265,000. The club celebrated its Centenary season in 2010/11 winning the Combined Counties League Cup final and getting through to two other semi-finals.

### Sandhurst Town History

In 2022 the club celebrated 110 years of football in the community. Covid-19 pandemic brought the 2021 season to a premature close and anniversary celebrations/events were cancelled. However, on hold there was a lot of positive and exciting things happening in the background at the club. Aimed at ensuring the longevity of the club for a further 100 years and beyond, a major relaunch of the club was completed, namely significant improvements, upgrades, and the enhancement of the facilities at Bottom Meadow as well as placing a major emphasis going forward on the values of education and further enhancing the social and community value of sport in Sandhurst and throughout Bracknell Forest.

In 2022, Gareth Price and his team began their 1st term in charge and started the Fizzers revival. Jordan Ive took over the reigns as first team manager at the start of 2023 and led the Fizzers to the Combined Counties Division One title and promotion to Step 5 into the ombined Counties Premier South. Jordan will continue to lead the team for the 2023/24 season.

We remain ambitious, our newly formed U18 teams, The SB Group Sport and Education Academy, Sandhurst Town and Bracknell Town will now benefit from a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, the first of its kind in the UK, completed during the summer of 2023, at the SB Stadium, Bottom Meadow, Sandhurst.


