

Management Mutterings

Good afternoon and welcome to Krooner Park, the home of Camberley Town F.C. for today's Combined Counties Premier Division South fixture. In particular of course to the Committee, Players, Management and supporters of our visitors Horley Town, and all our other visitors today. We hope you enjoy your stay with us this afternoon.

Saturday back at home against Guildford we knew we had to get a result as it's at home and it's an advantage playing on our pitch. The game started ok for both teams, putting the feeders out for who goes first for an attack. We did, and came close, but as the game settled into our patterns, we pushed more and more to attack. We went into the lead from a set piece which was nice to get from working on those in practice. So heading into the half at 1-0 was half the job done. Second half we needed to show some resilience from the weeks that have gone by, but sadly to our own faults again we let Guildford in to level the match around the hour mark. The key for us was patience. We were in the ascendency for the majority of the second half so it was just a case of telling the players to keep going and keep knocking on the door. The more they sat back the more we pushed, but as time was running out we needed to become more direct. It left spaces for a counter, but if we were positive in our play we would get the win. Which we did in injury time. A big relief and a lot of pressure off the shoulders of all the players. They know they could have played better, but the result of a win was all we needed, and we got it. So we move onto Knaphill which will be a free hit as they're sitting in second spot and just beat RPV in the cup Tuesday, we will give it a go!

We gave it a go.... In the first half. Stalemate at the half against Knaphill with a great low save from Stu to keep it level. The second half showed the strength and depth of the Knaphill squad. They didn't change the way they played, but they kept doing what they were doing at a higher intensity than us, which made it difficult for us to stop them from scoring. For their subs to replace players and then go and score three goals, where we looked like we hadn't changed any players at all although making all five subs, a 4-0 win was a tad harsh on the scoreline, but they deserved the win for the second half performance. They will be in the playoffs, so it's only 3 spaces left. It will be some run for us

to get into a playoff spot, but you never know, we will keep on fighting and believing that we can. And we need to have a positive result today against Horley. Hopefully we will have a bumper crowd to cheer us on with the 25 years since playing Brentford in the F.A Cup. It would be great to perform for those that make it to the game, and that played or were about, all that time ago. One thing the club shall still do from back then to now is we'll give it our all to grab the win.

Our History

The club was established in 1895 after a discussion at St Michael's church, and was originally named St Michael's Foot-ball Club, although they became known as St Michael's, Camberley. The first match, a friendly, was played on 16 October against D Company from the Royal Military College in nearby Sandhurst, St Michael's won 4–2. In January 1896 they joined the Surrey County Football Association, entering and winning the Surrey Junior Cup in 1897–98; the club's first competitive game was played on 16 October 1897, a Junior Cup first round match against Farncombe which St Michael's won 5–2. After winning the cup, the club joined the East & West Surrey League for the 1898–99 season.

In January 1901 a public meeting was held, at which it was decided to establish a new club that would absorb both St Michael's and Camberley Magpies. The name Camberley & Yorktown was adopted and the club took St Michael's place in the East & West Surrey League. However, they dropped into the Aldershot Combination in 1902, before switching to the Ascot & District League in 1903. The club finished as runners-up in their first season and went on to win the league in 1904–05. They were runners-up again in 1905–06, before winning a hat-trick of successive titles in 1907–08, 1908–09 and 1909–10, remaining unbeaten throughout the third of the title-winning seasons. The season also saw them win the Surrey Junior Cup for a second time, beating Sutton United 2–0 in the final. In 1910 Camberley & Yorktown returned to the East & West Surrey League, which had been renamed the West

Surrey League. In 1912–13 the club also entered the three-club Aldershot Senior Civilian League, which they won. They went on to win the West Surrey League the following season.

In 1922 Camberley & Yorktown were founder members of the Surrey Senior League. They won three successive titles in 1930 –31, 1931–32 and 1932–33 and were runners-up in 1938–39. After World War II the club was renamed Camberley, and were Surrey Senior League runners-up in 1946–47, before winning the league's Charity Cup in 1951–52 with a 4–3 win over Chertsey Town. The club were league runners-up again in 1961–62, and adopted their current name on 2 June 1967 after merging with former Parthenon League club

Camberley Wanderers. In 1973 they joined the Spartan League, but left to join Division Two of the Athenian League in 1975. In 1977 they switched to Division Two of the Isthmian League, and were promoted to Division One after finishing as Division Two runners-up in 1978–79. Two seasons later they were relegated, and after a single season back in Division Two, they rejoined the Athenian League, which now had a single division.

In 1983 Rick Wakeman became the club's chairman while he was living in Camberley. He remained in this post until 1986 when he was elected Vice-President, and left the club when he moved to the Isle of Man in 1988. In 1984 the Athenian League disbanded; Camberley rejoined the Isthmian League and were placed in Division Two South, where they remained until being placed in Division Three following league reorganisation in 1991. In 1998–99 the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time. Drawn against away to Third Division Brentford, they lost 5–0. Division Three became Division Two in 2002, and Camberley remained members until the end of the 2005–06 season, when they dropped into the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League through the FA's re-structuring of non-league football. They were runners-up in the division in 2013–14 and 2014–15.

They came third in the 2015-16 season in the North division of the Combined counties league 2016-17 saw a sixth place finish and seventh the season after. 2018-19 saw a sixteenth place finish and with the 2019-20 season not finishing and the 2020-21 one not even starting due to covid, they started the 2021-22 season in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and Manager Luke Turkington oversaw a twelfth place finish on 44 points. 2022-23 Season was an improvement on the previous finishing tenth with 52 Points, with a fantastic run of 1 defeat in the last 14 league games of the season, that was at a time when games were coming thick and fast as the season had to be extended by 2 weeks to make up for the bad weather earlier in the campaign.

GROUND

In 1898 the club started playing at the new Recreation Ground on London Road, although they also used a pitch near Southwell Park Road when the Recreation Ground was unavailable and had moved there permanently by 1905. They played there until moving to Martin's Meadow in 1909. However, when the tenancy came to an end, the club returned to the Recreation Ground.

Since 1923 the club have played at Krooner Park on Wilton Road. The ground was paid for with the winnings of a horse named Krooner who won two races at Haydock Park Racecourse in 1920.

It was officially opened on 26 December 1923. Due to financial difficulties Krooner Park was sold back to the local council in 1939 with the council guaranteeing that the ground would be retained in perpetuity and that it would be rented to the football club, giving them priority whilst they remained in existence. In the mid-1960s the club asked thee council to leave Krooner Park and build a new ground at South- cote Park Farm, but the request was rejected due to the amount of engineering that would be required.

Floodlights were installed at the ground in 1974, with the first floodlit match being a friendly against Crystal Palace on 14 October. The attendance at the match, which ended in a 1–1 draw, was around 3,100, a ground record. The highest confirmed attendance at Krooner Park was 2,066 when the newly-formed Aldershot Town visited for an Isthmian League Division Three match on 10 November 1992.

Horley Town
Formed: 1896
Home Ground: The New Defence
Last Season: 17th Combined Counties Premier South

Horley Football Club was first affiliated to Surrey County FA in 1896. In 1903 another local club by the name of Gatwick Rovers was formed and the two clubs merged in 1908 with Horley retaining its name. Both these original clubs played in the same colours of red and black and it was not until 1912 that Horley adopted the colours of claret and blue that they still wear to this very day. Intermediate football was tasted for the first time in season 1925/26 following an appearance in the Surrey County Junior Cup Final in 1923/24 and winning the Surrey County Junior Charity Cup in 1924/25.

Post-war Era

Following the Second World War, Horley was faced with the prospect of losing its home at "The Kings Head" ground and set about finding a new home. A local landowner by the name of Major A.L.N. Jennings became the Club's benefactor (and President) following his generous decision to give the club 10.7 acres of land in Smallfield Road. The land was held in trust for the people of Horley from 1947, in memory of those that died in the defence of their country, and the ground was appropriately named "The Defence". Season 1950/51 saw Horley win the Surrey Intermediate League Eastern Section and seek election to the Surrey Senior League for season 1951/52. This excursion into Senior football was short lived as the Club found themselves back in Junior football by season 1954/55. Intermediate status was regained in 1956/57 season and in season 1957/58 they entered their first ever Youth team in the local Redhill & District League.

The Seventies

With the expansion of the village of Horley to a town the Club changed its name in 1974 to become Horley Town F.C. During this spell in senior football, Horley Town enjoyed their most successful period culminating in the winning of the Surrey Senior League title and Surrey Senior League Challenge Cup in 1976/77. The Club also reached the final of the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup in this season. The club went on to compete in the London Spartan League and the Athenian League before returning to the Combined Counties League (formerly the Surrey Senior League).

The Modern Era

The early 1980's saw the Club expand their interest in Youth football with the creation of Horley Town Minors. This relationship has grown over the years and is the reason why the Club has evolved into a well respected "community club" providing football for the people of Horley irrespective of age, sex or race. In September 2003, Horley Town moved to their new ground, named "The New Defence" in deference to their old home, behind the Horley Adult Education Centre, which has now been demolished and replaced by the new Horley Leisure Centre. The Club has been in the Combined Counties League Premier Division since 2006 but in 2019 changed to the Southern Combination League.

Horley Town History

In addition to its Reserves and Youth teams, incorporates successful junior football teams at all age levels. 2013/14 saw Horley Town FC appoint Ex player and club stalwart defender Anthony Jupp as manager alongside former player Chris Weller. 2014/2015 season the Club had a very successful season finishing 6th in the League the highest position for years and the most ever points. The Club also had the league Top goal scorer Ashley Nadasan who scored 99 goals in the last two seasons before signing form League One side Fleetwood Town, in a three year professional contract.

2015/16 was again another successful season for Town, but big changes came in the Close season with Anthony Jupp and Chris Weller standing down and experienced ex Dorking boss Glynn Stephens stepping in as manager. More work was completed on the ground with a further 52 seats fitted this time to the stand behind the goal. 2017/18 saw the club get through to the fourth Round of the FA Vase the furthest the club has even gone on narrowly losing to Chichester City. After a very poor start to the season and crashing out of all the Cups in was a big disappointment for the Club that in January 2019 with the Club in a relegation place Glynn Stephens resigned and walked away from the Club. Ex manager Anthony Jupp was brought in to steady the ship and to try and avoid relegation on a temporary basis. For the 2019/20 season Anthony took over a permanent manager and the club changed league to the Southern Combination League Premier Division from the Combined Counties League Premier Division. Reyon Dillon signed professional forms with Cork City in January 2020 and scored and his first game for them after signing from Town.

2020/21 the Club started a new team the Horley Town Under 23's. The side went on the the Semi Final of the Cup before losing to Chichester City in the semi Final. 2021/22 Season saw the Club forced to move from the Southern Combination League back to the Combined Counties League and losing an appeal with the F.A.



November 14th 1998. Brentford v Camberley Town – FA Cup 1st Round

What a journey it had been for the Krooners to reach the 1st Round of the Cup for the 1st time ever.

Memories from Barrie Funnell

5th Sept 1998 – Preliminary Round - Wokingham (A) - We recorded a sound 2-0 win. Last game of the cricket season which I would normally be at but it was a wet day. Maybe an omen for greater things to come.

19th Sept 1998 – 1st Qualifying Round – Arundel (A) – Probably one of the nicest on-league grounds with an unreal view of the castle. It was a lovely warm day and a superb team performance saw us through 7-0.

3rd Oct 1998 – 2nd Qualifying Round – Ringmer (H) – A real tough game against a very competitive outfit saw us make the 3rd Qualifying Round with a tight 2-1 win.

17th Oct 1998 – 3rd Qualifying Round – Braintree Town (A) – Not a hope for us with a really tough draw against an in-form side that were making their way up the non-league ladder. A good day for football saw us show our pedigree with some superb football and we came away with a deserved 3-1win.

31st Oct 1998 – 4th Qualifying Round – St Blazey (A) – So here we were again for the 2nd year running. Last year a replay saw us bow out and this year we made the long trek into Cornwall to take on an unknown quantity. The home side had not made the 1st Round either so it was always going to be a special day. The fans travelled down on the day in dreadful conditions but despite all the rain the home side worked wonders to ensure the game was on. Graced with a Premier League referee we once again showed our class with a 2-0 win to take us into the promised land of the 1st Round for the first time ever. And so we waited in the bar afterwards with some very gracious locals to watch the draw........Brentford away! The drive home was much sweeter with the win and draw.

SATURDAY 14th NOVEMBER 1998

As a fan the match at St Blazey will always stay with me for a number of reasons, however, this day was always going to be special. Suddenly all the laughs and banter about supporting my local side were replaced with "Where do I get tickets" We organised coaches, yes coaches, to travel up to the game. Around a thousand fans made their way up to Griffin Park intent on making it a day to remember for everyone involved with the club. The only place to be was the away end. I took up a position in the seated area as I was reporting live for local radio. I refused a press ticket because I wanted to be with all these people who were supporting my club. The game came and went in an instant. Goals, red cards and missed penalties saw us depart the worlds best cup competition 5-0.

Helds were held high. The players who represented the shirt that day will remain idols and friends of mine and I really hope to see many of them here today. You cannot buy the feeling I got with the run we had. I witnessed every second of the cup run and it will stay with me for the rest of my life. They say that you do not choose your club but your club chooses you. Well, thank you Camberley Town for choosing me. Here is to the next great chapter in our history.


